(for school years 1-3)

(for school years 4-6)



There is a separate programme on Sunday mornings for our Youth (years 7-10 and 11-13). There are also various events for Youth on Sunday evenings.



Mid-week groups include Navigate, for children in school years 3-6, and Wednesday Night Youth for young people in school years 7-10. We also visit SPREE every year and a group of our young people recently took part in an overseas mission trip.

OUR YOUTH VALUES (Three Ships)



Discipleship: UV Youth exists to disciple young people in their faith, helping them to build a deeper relationship with the Creator and Sustainer of the universe.



Fellowship: UV Youth is committed to creating a safe, supportive and exciting space in which young people can explore their faith. We want each and every young person to feel accepted, included, challenged and enthused as they welcome, support and challenge each other on their spiritual journeys.



Sail the Ship: At UV Youth we believe God has an exciting plan for our lives. We want to help our young people explore what that is and how they can use their unique gifts to serve God in His church and wider community.



THE JOB ROLE

Overview: To maintain, develop and oversee a discipleship programme for young people aged 11-18. To provide support for families to become key discipleship units, working alongside the Children's Pastor to enable parents to grow faith in their children aged 0-18.

This will be achieved specifically through:

- Delivering a biblical, foundational, teaching programme across Sunday and mid-week activities.
- Overseeing the mentoring provision for 11-18s.
- For those not yet Christians, enabling young people to explore faith for themselves and encouraging them on their faith journey.
- Offering young people pastoral support and/or spiritual guidance.
- Helping the young people discern their own giftings and creating opportunities for them to develop these giftings within Youth and the wider Church and community.
- Developing, training, growing and leading the Youth volunteer teams. This will include setting culture and values for the Youth Ministry and arranging appropriate training, etc
- Ensuring that safeguarding procedures and training are up to date for all the Youth team, and all activities are appropriately risk-assessed and staffed.
- Managing the youth budget to resource the events in the programme.
- Meeting and communicating with the Church Staff Team to ensure that Youth Ministry is engaged with the wider vision and planning of the Church.
- Maintaining communication and providing some support for the Acorn Alternative Provision centre at Upton Vale. Acorn School has up to eight pupils with complex social and emotional needs. The school is managed by Acorn Alternative Provision.
- Providing support to the families in our church, helping parents to bring up their children to know and love the Lord Jesus.
- Building relationship with families who attend on a Sunday, and/or during the week.
- Being an advocate in our church and a voice to our leadership team, for families with children aged 0-18.



Specific activities will include, but not be limited to:

- Age-specific teaching streams on a Sunday morning/evening.
- Mid-week Youth provision (currently weekly during term time) including Youth Alpha.
- Mid-week provision for families in the form of informal social sessions, parenting courses, faith courses.
- One-off events, activities, and retreats e.g. Spree SW, Devon Christian Youth Camps.
- Weekly Staff Team meetings.
- Supporting some activities within the Acorn Provision.
- Working alongside the Children's Pastor as they support families in the church.

PERSON SPECIFICATIONS

Essential:

- A follower of Jesus who is committed to personal discipleship and growing in their faith.
- A theological view in line with the Evangelical Alliance Statement of Faith and holding an orthodox view specifically in the areas of biblical authority and sexual ethics.
- It is a Genuine Occupational Requirement (GOR) of the post that the post holder will be a Christian.
- Willingness to become a member of Upton Vale and be an active part of our worshipping community.
- Experience of working with young people (preferably within a church context).
- Ability to work within the constraints of strict confidentiality in respect of safeguarding, pastoral care and access to databases.
- A capacity for good organisation.
- It is a requirement to agree to the Safeguarding Policy of the church, undergo DBS and other necessary checks before commencing employment.
- Entitlement to live and work in the UK.
